Committee to decide fate of voter choice bill

OKLAHOMA CITY – Oklahomans for Ballot Access Reform (OBAR) is asking the people of Oklahoma to contact their state legislators about **House Bill 1072**, which would make it easier for small political parties to get on the ballot.

HB 1072 has been assigned to a **conference committee** where both House and Senate members are trying to agree on the bill's final version, or whether to pass the bill at all.

Listed below are the **conference committee** members. The best way to convince the members to support **HB 1072** is for them to hear from constituents who want the bill to pass. Otherwise, the bill likely will be allowed to fail and so will another chance at giving Oklahoma voters more choices on Election Day.
